How to Use

1 Start by capturing the child's attention with the amazing moving images.

- > Place the striped plastic sheet over the speech bubble in the first spread and slowly slide it from left to right. The image will begin to move!
- > In the same way, show the child the other animations in the tract.

2 Return to the cover page to begin sharing the message of salvation.

3 Show the animations on each page again as your presentation proceeds.

Use **Bible Verses** where appropriate, but be careful not to overload your listener with too many verses.







Have you heard about the true meaning of Christmas? Let's read this together to learn about the real reason for celebrating Christmas.



